











## Delight as community set for massive £60k boost with food firmly on the menu

Both Associations and local charity "Golden Friendships" obtained the bumper windfall primarily to help defeat food inequality, social isolation and help the local community emerge from the pandemic.

Now a range of projects lasting from October to March and funded by the Scottish Government's *"Communities Recovery Fund"* – set up to alleviate some of the hardships caused by the pandemic - will swing into action.

Both housing associations are delighted with the windfall which will benefit people of all ages and particularly children.

The overall aim is to tackle food poverty and inequality, reduce isolation especially among those in later life, strengthen existing community partnerships and promote togetherness among residents.

The main project is entitled "Dalmuir Diners" with a firm emphasis on enjoying food, having fun and creating friendships

Some of the eye-catching projects coming soon include:

A new "Dalmuir Diners" initiative offering lunches and dinners to take place on Wednesday afternoons and Thursday evenings at the Golden Friendships Community Hall

Lunch clubs lasting 23 weeks at our two sheltered housing developments in Nairn Street and Shaftesbury Street

An "Easter Egg Extravaganza" in April 2022 benefiting three local schools, Golden Friendships and our Out of School Care Group.

Support for the Dalmuir Out of School Care Group in several ways including an "Everyone for Fruit" initiative and a "Plot, Learn & Grow" project on an established allotment.

## Christmas dinners and pantomimes to spread some festive cheer.

Anne Marie Brown, our Chief Executive said: "This is a hugelysignificant development as it provides a much needed helping hand in the recovery of our communities from the pandemic.

"We are very grateful indeed to the Scottish Government for awarding us this money – every penny of which will be put to good use as we endeavour to help as many people as possible.

"Dealing with food inequality through many of the projects being funded with this money is vital as we know it is an increasing issue with people struggling to cope. We are ready to get to work to tackle this head on."
